

As most of you will now be aware summer 2011 has seen the sale of Komfort Workspace by SIG Plc along with Leaderflush Shapland, Tufwell Glass (formerly known as SIG Glazing Services) and Cubicle Systems all operating under the umbrella of SIG Interiors Manufacturing Division.

The sale of SIG Interiors Manufacturing Division to Laidlaw supported by Rutland Partners, represents a new start for the Komfort business supported by a strong financial backer and an industry leading partner in Laidlaw. As a result of the acquisition the interests of Laidlaw and what were the SIG Interiors Manufacturing businesses will now all operate under the heading of Laidlaw Interiors Group.

This is a positive move for the Komfort business. Rutland have a successful track record of investing in businesses like Komfort and have ambitious plans to take the whole business forward.

This acquisition creates the leading supplier into the UK commercial interiors market for doorsets, ironmongery and partition systems. The group will have combined revenues of approximately £130 million and a market leading position in all three product sectors. Evelyn Grace Academy

Komfort's PolarTec system was selected for the schools drive for excellence.



Stop Press... Evelyn Grace Academy won the Stirling Prize 2011

"Excellence, Endeavour and Self Discipline"

Excellence, Endeavour and Self Discipline. These three principles are used to shape the students within EGA's walls. And arguably the principle architect Zaha Hadid applied to the design of her first school. Hadid, is one of the pre-eminent architectural superstars in the world. Last year she won British architecture's highest honour, the Stirling Prize, for the MAXXI art gallery in Rome, and her Londonbased office is working on projects across the globe. Her next London project, and second project in the UK was the Aquatics Centre for the 2012 London Olympics.

Hadid was born in Baghdad, Iraq in 1950 and moved to study at the Architectural Association School of Architecture in London. It was in 1980 that she established her London based practice and went on to win many competitions worldwide for her groundbreaking designs.

In 2004 Hadid became the first female recipient of the Pritzker Architecture Prize and in 2008 she ranked 69th on the Forbes list of "Worlds Most Powerful Women". Brixton's first ever secondary school was designed by Hadid, to be open light, and to minimise any potential problematic zones. The school has been designed in such a way as to prevent any possible hiding places.

The new Academy originally opened on a temporary site in 2008 and moved to its new location in Shakespeare Road, Brixton in September 2010. On one side of the railway that lies near to the Evelyn Grace Academy is leafy Dulwich Village. On the other side however, are a number of notorious estates. The London Borough of Lambeth has one of the highest crime rates in Europe and hits all six categories that are used to measure social deprivation.

Governor and hedge fund manager for the school, David Gorton, chose to contribute £2million of his own money towards the £38million school. Gorton chose architect Hadid because he knew her work would make a striking visual statement. EGA is one of eight academies in Britain that is sponsored by ARK Schools. ARK (Absolute Return for Kids) is a charity that was founded ten years ago by the French financier Arpad Busson to raise the bar for children living in the most disadvantaged communities. ARK works with the Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF) and local authorities to create new schools that offer exceptional opportunities to local children in inner cities.

The overall design has enabled the school to be divided into two wings and maintains the educational principle of smaller schools, as four schools are run within the academy. The design has created natural segregation patterns that all sit within functional spaces. Each school has its own identity and houses 270 pupils with the upper schools housing 330 pupils. The subdivided school ensures a more intimate teaching approach which influences the schools core values of excellence, endeavour and self-discipline.



Large spaces have been designed in such a way to maximise natural light and ventilation. This type of learning environment is spatially reassuring and therefore acts to actively engage the students. The communal zones that are shared by all four schools were designed to encourage communication and eradicate any problematic areas that may require supervision. The academy cost far less than a museum to build per square metre but significantly more than an average office building.



To allow for generous levels of natural lighting and ventilation the classrooms were constructed on either side of broad central corridors.

To maximise this flow of light, Komfort's PolarTec glazed partitioning was specified by Bamber & Reddan Architects. Its excellent sound insulation, acoustic properties and crowd pressure credentials were considerations in the selection.

The flexibility of PolarTec allowed for the partitioning to produce angles at ceiling height which replicated the geometric shapes of the building's exterior. Komfort also supplied full height solid doors with vision panels.



Training Manager awarded MBE



Brian Pike, Komfort's Training Manager was awarded an MBE in the Queen's Honours Birthday List. Brian was nominated for his MBE by the AIS, Association of Interior Specialists for his involvement over the last 21 years with the Partitioning Interiors Association (PIA) and now the AIS. Brian has served on various committees for both Associations including training committees, technical committees, CITB NVQ Industry Working Group and City & Guilds NVQ Working Group.

The British honours system is one of the oldest in the world. It has evolved over 650 years as a recognition of merit, gallantry and service.

An MBE is the Most Excellent order of the British Empire. The award is an order of chivalry that was established by King George V in 1917 to fill the gaps in the British Honours System. The honour is awarded by the King or Queen for a particular achievement and to people from all walks of life and society who have made a real difference to their community.

Honours lists are published twice a year; New Year and mid-June on the date of The Queen's official birthday. Brian Pike was awarded his Order for services to the construction industry. During the last twenty five years Brian's knowledge of UK and European building regulations has enabled him to detail technical developments within contruction that has saved lives. Demountable partitions with enhanced structural, fire and acoustic performance characteristics have been developed that will increase escape time should a commercial building catch fire.

Brian's Order was also in recognition of the huge amount of time he has volunteered to make improvements in the construction industry and he is recognised as an ambassador for the commercial interiors industry.

Brian was stunned with the award; 'this is the first MBE for our sector of the construction industry so this is an incredible honour that I will always hold very dear".



Floating partitions



MF Global signed to take 105,000 sq ft at Wafic Said's 5 Churchill Place in Canary Wharf, and in April this year the fit-out was complete.

MF Global's office space covers the ground and first to fourth floors. Architects MCM were selected to design the interior of the area, having specialised in interior design in commercial and public sector projects including Marks & Spencer and Barclays.

MCM has worked hard to ensure their business is conducted in a sustainable manner, and also advise their clients on the sustainable initiatives that are available through the design process. The UK economic climate now favours refurbishments as a cost-effective way of creating office space. Komfort's Ls90 was selected for the executive meeting rooms and VC suites as it has been engineered to accommodate future change, whether it is relocating an individual or entire suite of offices, for its acoustic performance and aesthetics.

With sustainability such an important issue, Ls90 has been designed for disassembly enabling components to be recovered from site at the end of their useful life and entered into the relevant industry's recycling programme. Ls90 is the reusable bi-panel partition system for sustainable buildings. This bi-panel characteristic facilitates speed of build with quality-controlled factory prepared elements. Modules are interchangeable from glass to solid without disturbance to adjacent components. Its hung panel design, with recessed base and head incorporating ± 25mm deflection, creates a true floating panel effect with no visible framing on solid elements. Ls90's unique door frame, junctions and flush panel-to-panel elements enhance this minimal aesthetic.

For the bulk of the offices the architect chose a combination of single and double glazed Polar complete with two part deflection heads.

The most striking aspect of this project was the architect's clever use of colour on the deflection head detail and the glass combinations. The two parts of the deflection head were powder

coated white to match the ceiling colour and silver for the section that housed the glass. This created the impression of the partition floating below the ceiling and also minimising the aesthetic impact of the head channels.


The architect used individual coloured laminated glass on each floor to clearly differentiate each floor at a glance. The coloured glass creates a striking and vibrant working environment. The colours react differently to the lighting levels both natural and artificial, providing a constantly changing environment throughout the day. The use of coloured glass further enhances the privacy levels within the offices.

The standard of the quality of the partitioning and coloured glass is a real triumph for MCM Architects and Komfort. •

Augmented reality

How AR can help the architecture and design industry



120 entrance packs were requested, 40 entries were submitted, 14 entries were shortlisted, 380 invites were sent out and it all boiled down to Komfort's Augmented Reality (AR) Award Ceremony on Friday 8th April.

The competition was to design an area as your perfect workspace. This could have been anything from a loft space in the city or a rural idyll. We all have our own ideas.

The event was held at Komfort's London showroom in Bonhill Street and kicked off with canapés and a champagne reception.

Once everyone who had submitted an entry was through the door, along with Komfort's top clients and many important architects, everyone was able to view the shortlisted entries in their gallery like fashion, suspended from the ceiling.

The judges had a tough time as

"the standard of creativity was excellent and it was difficult to separate the top three"

stated Colin Watson of BCFA. Peter Karn of MET Studio snapped up first place with 'Gravitate'. Peter Karn's entry had a real ambiance factor. The workspace allows you to travel between floors, spaces and environment according to your mood, i.e. L1 is the play floor and L4 is the Nature Floor.

As a designer, Peter felt that "every day people sit at the same desk looking at the same

space which can be very uninspiring" so it was important to come up with a design that "users can move through and work in the ambience that suits them at a specific time". There was also a surprise second place prize for Robert Eyles and his entry 'Time Capsule'.

The prize giving was followed by a speech from Justin Haylock; Komfort's Augmented Reality specialist who highlighted the importance of AR within the Architecture and Design industry.

AR cards were issued and once held up in front of the iMac's webcam's, the users could see the winning entry in its AR state.

Augmented Reality is a term for a live direct view of a physical, real-world environment. The elements of this view are augmented, or enhanced using a computer generated input; a webcam for example.

Drawings are created, and then formed into a marker, almost like a barcode, and when using hardware the marker turns into a 3D impression in real time.

Floor plans can be designed, and then markers positioned to create a real time depiction of the concept. This can be moved and rotated, casting shadows and representing real space, in essence the most spatially aware 3D model. A fantastic spread of food and drink was available throughout the night, and the quirky 'mini fish and chips' catered for everyone's needs.

The evening was a great success for Komfort and everyone who attended was able to mingle and network with key contacts, suppliers, architects and designers.

The award ceremony highlighted the importance of Augmented Reality in relation to Architecture and Design. Architecture, both internal and external, is one of the many professions that can benefit and grow with the development of virtual reality technologies.






Newly expanded Technical Team

New Enhanced Komfort Laminated Glass

(6.4, 6.8 & 7.5mm)

Komfort is pleased to announce with immediate effect that there will be an enhancement to the composition of the 6.4, 6.8 and 7.5mm clear laminated glass that we supply.

To date these glass thicknesses have comprised two layers of 3mm clear float glass laminated together with the relevant interlayer to achieve the overall thickness. The new laminated glass will now comprise two layers of Pilkingtons Optiwhite E and the same interlayers.

This is good news because the product has the characteristic of a clearer appearance desired by specifiers and occupiers alike that has hitherto only been available at a premium. Komfort are pleased to offer this product at the same price as the old float based product.

All of the mechanical and acoustic properties of the new laminated product remain unchanged from the previous glass. There are enhanced light and solar transmittance properties over the standard product and the U value remains the same. What does this mean in practice?

A The Optiwhite or low iron glass comes into its own when you have multiple glazed runs in parallel. The characteristic 'green tint' inherent in float glass means that looking through a number of runs soon results in a loss of visibility. This effect is minimised when Optiwhite is used due to its greater clarity.

Will it match my existing glass?

A. The vast majority of single and double glazed partition installations when viewed perpendicular to the run will be indistinguishable from the old product. Where multiple offices in parallel are installed to match existing layouts you will notice that the transparency is enhanced.

What are the benefits?

When offices are installed around the perimeter of a building the light transference into the inner offices will be improved, thereby improving the working environment.

Maximising space

How Ls90 can help you

When it comes to selecting partitioning systems for your commercial space, the final decision will usually come down to two factors, flexibility and cost. Flexibility is vital in any commercial space to ensure the area can keep up with the ever changing demands of the business. Also in this current climate, cost is at the forefront of every business mind.

A case in 1958 involving shipping agents in Hull set the precedent for the tax benefits that businesses enjoy today for relocatable partitioning. John Good & Sons had a decision overturned at the Court of Appeal having originally been denied any tax relief for its expenditure on partitioning. The original inspectors view was that the partitioning was part of their building and therefore did not qualify for any tax allowances. The shipping agents however argued that they had specifically asked the architects to ensure that the interior of their new offices was flexible enough to allow for alteration in their ever changing business environment. As a result, the partitioning selected consisted of hardboard inserted into metal ribs screwed into the floor and ceilings. So the partitioning was relatively easy to relocate.

It was concluded that the partitioning intended to be relocatable to meet the needs of an ever changing environment and tax allowances were therefore due. The court's conclusion for this appeal is the basis for today's allowances. Changes in the 2007 budget meant that business owners should be even more receptive to relocatable partitioning than ever before.

Having established that the expenditure is allowable, the new annual investment allowance (AIA) introduced with the Finance Act 2008 comes into play. The AIA provides 100% relief on the first £100,000 worth of qualifying expenditure after 6 April 2010 and thus increases the amount of relief immediately available to business owners.

Any qualifying expenditure above £100,000 then attracts a 20% writing down allowance (WDA). It should be noted that the annual investment allowance is 100% of the first £100,000 expenditure on all plant in a given accounting period and that a group of companies will only receive one allowance of £100,000 across the group. All the same, it is an allowance worth having.

If the partitions are not movable they are considered to be part of the building and no tax relief is available. The availability of the 100% annual allowance and 20% writing down allowance means that 91% of expenditure will attract tax relief after the first six years. The writing down allowances will continue in future years on the ever decreasing annual balances.

As well as the added tax benefits, a huge advantage of any demountable wall system is its flexibility. When changes need to be made to any space, it's far less expensive to move demountable walls than to tear down and rebuild drywall offices. Komfort's Ls90 system is the reusable bi-panel partition system for sustainable buildings.

This bi-panel characteristic facilitates speed of build with quality-controlled factory prepared elements. Modules are interchangeable from glass to solid without disturbance to adjacent components. Demountable wall construction will save three to four weeks on a schedule.

A third major benefit from movable partitioning is in its relocation costs. In comparison to the use of drylining, any added cost from movable partitioning will be offset in any first move. Firstly, unlike drywall, which requires taping, joint treatment and the application of paint or wall-covering, movable partitions are prefinished. Therefore movable partitions can be relocated very quickly.


With sustainability such an important issue, Ls90 has been designed for disassembly enabling components to be recovered from site at the end of their useful life and entered into the relevant industry's recycling programme. There is little waste in comparison to tearing down drylining walls.

Ls90 has been engineered to accommodate future change, whether it is relocating an individual or entire suite of offices, to simply upgrading a boardroom for improved acoustic performance. It is a partitioning system, which has impressive performance qualities, yet maintains the flexibility to allow specifiers to achieve innovative design.

Demountable wall systems allow for design options that blend in effectively with the open office environment. Ls90's hung panel design, with recessed base and head incorporating ± 25mm deflection, creates a true floating panel effect with no visible framing on solid elements. Ls90's unique doorframe, junctions and flush panel-to-panel elements enhance this minimal aesthetic.

New office plan terms such as "flex space" have now become part of office culture. Now, more than ever, there is a demand to use construction products that allow the construction to fit the design needs as opposed to limiting the design to try to fit the process. ●


