## Safety at Street Works





The new Red Book (Safety at Street Works) was published on 1st October 2013, and has been a legal requirement since 1st October 2014.

This Code of Practice shows the principles that must be followed with regard signeage, lighting and guarding at a road works site; the objective being to ensure a safe work zone for workers, motorists and pedestrians alike.

At just 100 pages, the red book is simple-to-follow and shows typical layouts, equipment and working methods. Much of the content originates from Chapter 8 of the Traffic Signs Manual and the red book advises users to seek further guidance on traffic safety measures from this source.

Failure to comply with the red book is a criminal offence.










Short duration works - up to 1 hour max. (30 mins in Scotland); Basic Layout applies for longer duration works.


























Mobile works on a single carriageway

Mobile works are carried out from a vehicle moving significantly slower than the prevailing traffic speed activities such as grass cutting, hedge cutting etc.

7403 signs have amber beacons in each corner.

## Additional signege items for particular circumstances / tasks

Extra visibility & Distance to site Red Book p16-17






Extra advanced warning signs required for when there is limited visibility on the approach to the works - eg on a bend, brow of a hill, dip in

road etc.
Distance supplementary plates compulsory for the advance warning signs on roads with a speed limit of 50mph+

Pedestrian safety Red Book p28-34







Site information sign Red Book p23



Compulsory for most sites, but recommended for all.

Priority signs Red Book p58-59









For circumstances when 2-way traffic is not possible.

For works of <80m long, with traffic flow of <42 vehicles per 3 minutes.

Stop Works Red Book p73-74





Use Stop Works lollipop signs to stop traffic for max. 2 mins per 15 mins.

Use 2pcs for manoevring plant or works vehicles
